THE CHOUTEAUS - EARLY FUR TRADERS

Answer the following questions:

- 1. These two brothers were born in the 1700's and died in the 1800's.
- 2. Where were they born? <u>New Orleans</u>
- 3. What country were their parents from? France
- 4. Of what city are they considered to be "founders"? <u>St. Louis</u>
- 5. What native people controlled the Missouri area at this time? Osage Indians
- 6. What did the Chouteaus want from the Osage in trade? Furs (or pelts)
- 7. What did the Osage want from the Chouteaus in trade? <u>Muskets, knives, kettles,</u> <u>blankets, ribbons and other imported goods</u>
- 8. What was the "key to success" for the Chouteaus? <u>Having good relations with the</u> <u>Indian tribes that supplied their furs</u>
- 9. Many Osage today are related to the Chouteaus. Why would this be? <u>The Chouteaus</u> <u>lived among the Osage at times, having children with Indian wives</u>
- 10. What was the effect of the Treaty of 1808, negotiated by Pierre Chouteau? <u>The Osage</u> <u>ceded huge areas of land in Missouri and Arkansas (52 million acres)</u>
- 11. Where did the Chouteaus live the latter parts of their lives? <u>St. Louis</u>
- **12.** In what areas of business were they involved, besides the fur trade? <u>real estate</u>, <u>banking, iron manufacturing, railroads, mining, and utilities</u>.
- **13.** Jean Pierre's oldest son, Auguste Pierre Chouteau, later became an influential trader in the <u>Three Forks</u> region of Oklahoma (southeast of Tulsa, near Muscogee).
