- 7. Where does Bird Creek begin? <u>High tallgrass prairie pastures of north Osage County</u>
- 8. Bird Creek joins the <u>Verdigris</u> River near Tulsa.
- 9. A river <u>fork</u> is a place where a river divides into two (or even three) parts.
- 10. What three rivers join together at Three Forks (near Muscogee)?
